

CEP – CLUB EXCELLENCE PROCESS

What comments are being made about your Club? Do you hear things like this: “My Lions club experience led me to think this is a good ole boys club that does not warmly welcome women or minorities.” Or “All we do is meet and talk about weather or how things use to be.” Wouldn’t it be great if the comments sounded like this, “I love being a Lion. I think it is a great organization that serves the community in so many ways. It is a great way to meet new people.”

All clubs have stumbling blocks, because clubs are diverse. Members might have different ideas about what their clubs should do and how things should be done.

Lions International has developed a program to provide all Lions with resources to strengthen their clubs. The Club Excellence Process (CEP) is a workshop program dedicated to club improvement. A club that agrees to participate in the CEP will be guided by a trained facilitator throughout the process. A participating club will look at their community’s needs, take a survey on their membership experience, use resources and develop action plans.
