#### District 14H Sight First & Hearing Committee Minutes July 11, 2019 meeting

**Members present:** DG Fran Stepkovitch, VDG/PDG Dave Barrett, PDG Karen Cokely, IPDG/PDG Bill Metschulat, PDG Cathy Metschulat, Gordie Potratz, PDG Butch and Josie Sands, Ernie Seagraves, PDG Joe and Shirley Skinner, Dr. Ken and Pam Savitski, PCC Mark Kusma, Roger Wallace, Mari Olshefski, Bill Igoe and Barb Taylor Guests: Preston Barrett, University of Scranton's Dr. Julie Nastasi and Meg Hambrose.

President PDG Butch Sands called the meeting to order with members reciting the **Pledge of Allegiance**. President Lion Roger Wallace welcomed everyone to South Abington.

**Minutes from the last meeting** were provided via email and newsletter. The minutes were approved based on motion by PDG Pam Savitski.

Lion Irene Masco indicated the Sight Treasurer's report has the following amounts: \$4363.68 for Sight First after the deposit of the Fair Share \$1,602.50, transfer to Kidsight of \$1.980 and Health Fair table @ VNA, Olyphant of \$25, for a new total of \$3,961.18 \$1923.45 for Kidsight after the deposit of grant monies received \$5,000, transfer of \$1,980 from Sight First, payment of \$6,980 to School Health for new camera and \$92.44 for supplies for printer, for a new total of \$1,831.01. Bringing the new total balance to \$5792.19 A motion to accept was made by PDG Joe Skinner, seconded by Lion Bill Igoe and passed unanimously.

Two applications have been completed for the new year and no new applications.

PDG Karen Cokely reported that the **Hearing account balance** started with \$1,747.27 with a deposit from Montrose co-pay, applicant co-pay and Fair Share in the amount of \$1,802.50. A check was written in the amount of \$500 to Abington Audiology leaving a balance of \$3,049.77. A motion to accept was made by Lion Bill Igoe, seconded by Lion Barb Taylor and passed unanimously.

**OLD BUSINESS** Prior to the meeting there was a presentation by our guests Dr. Julie and Meg of the University of Scranton, followed by a Q&A. They are in the beginning of their fundraiser where they are seeking to raise \$10,000. Lion Dr. Ken suggested that a grant from LCIF may be applicable and PDG Bill Metschulat stated that a grant from NEPA Lions Service Foundation may be as well. Continued conversation was had after the guests left to see what we as Lions would be able to do.

Continued conversation...Lion Dr. Ken commented that usually when donations are made like this, it is to keep the equipment there for all to use and future clients, but this is equipment such as goggles to go out into the community. Lion Gordie suggested that we make a stipulation that it stays in house. Lion Barb commented that this is not the time to be considering giving a donation with the Kidsight monies still due. Lion Gordie suggested that we revisit this next meeting and each meeting afterwards until we have an answer to what we can or will do. PDG Butch agreed with Lion Dr. Ken. Lion Dr. Ken also mentioned that the clinic has a trust fund that they inherited and he also reiterated that the equipment would have to stay in house. PDG Pam and PCC Mark commented that the District Counselors Fund has monies and to get a matching grant. It was agreed that this would be discussed again at the next meeting after PCC Mark, Lion Dr. Ken and PDG Bill have the appropriate time to review the documents that the ladies had provided. Motion made by Lion Barb, seconded by Lion Shirley Skinner and passed unanimously.

An update was given by PDG Cathy Metschulat concerning the funding for the new Spot Camera. The Scranton Area Community Foundation grant requires a PA Bureau of Charity Organization Certificate; which

the district does not have. She wrote a letter to the foundation requesting that we be held exempt and had it signed by DG Fran Stepkovitch. The grant will be submitted accordingly.


