Morgan has issued a call for the 2019-2020 PA State Council of Lions Clubs' Council of Governors to convene for its third Regular Meeting at 1:00 p.m. Saturday, February 8, 2020 at the Ramada by Wyndham State College Hotel & Conference Center, 1450 South Atherton Street, State College, PA. 2020 at the hotel.

In addition to the State Council meetings, select state committees will hold meetings Saturday morning, February 8, 2020 at the hotel. State committee chairpersons and coordinators desiring to be assigned meeting times and space must contact the State Office prior to December 31, 2019.

Two meal functions -- a luncheon and an evening banquet -- will be held Saturday, February 8, 2020, as part of the State Council meeting weekend. An RSVP form is included in this Call of Meeting packet.

Individuals desiring discounted overnight accommodations (\$80.00/night plus tax) at the Ramada by Wyndham State College will need to <u>call the hotel reservation desk at (814) 238 3001</u>. Online reservations will not be available. Please use code "CG07LC" or "the Pennsylvania Lions State Council Meeting" when calling to make reservations. The discounted rate is only valid for reservations made through January 7, 2020.

Committee chairpersons/coordinators who have an Action Item for State Council to consider at the February 8, 2020 meeting must submit that item in written form to the State Office no later than Wednesday, January 22, 2020. Any Action Item proposal received by the State Office less than 14 days prior to a State Council meeting must be approved by a two-thirds vote (12 of 18) of the Council of Governors before it may be presented for consideration. An Action Item that does not receive the needed two-thirds vote for consideration will be tabled until the next State Council meeting. Committee chairpersons/coordinators with Action Items must be present or have a representative at both the Preliminary and Regular State Council meetings. With some notable exceptions, all oral committee reports to State Council will be subject to a three-minute time limit. Complete versions of all written committee reports will be included in the official minutes of the State Council meeting.

District 14H Sight First & Hearing Committee Minutes of November 14, 2019

Members present DG Fran and Ed Stepkovitch, VDG/PDG Dave Barrett, PDG Karen Cokely PDG Butch and Josie Sands, Ernie Seagraves, Barbara Taylor, Dale Ferguson, PDG Gene Scagliotti, Dale Wilsey, Steve Harris, Steve Patton, PDG Cathy Metschulat, PCC Mark Kusma, Gordi and Judy Potratz.

President PDG Butch Sands called the meeting to order with members reciting the Pledge of Allegiance

.

The Tunkhannock Lions Club hosted tonight's meeting and President Lion Steve Patton welcomed everyone, thanking them for coming out to the meeting. He thanked the veterans that were in attendance and asked them to stand to be recognized. They were Dale Ferguson from Falls, PDG Gene Scagliotti from Scott Township and Dale Wilsey from Tunkhannock Lions Clubs. He mentioned that earlier today the Tunkhannock Lions Quest sponsored an inspirational speaker at the Tunkhannock High School; then came home to hear of another school shooting. Minutes from the last meeting were provided via email and newsletter. There were two corrections that needed to be made. The first was in paragraph 5 concerning the Hearing accounts balance. The \$500 deposit was not from the Tunkhannock Lions Club. \$50 was from applicant co-pay Vohrer, \$250 was from Montrose's co-pay, \$200 was Hawley/Lake Wallenpaupak co-pay for a total of \$500 and one check written in the amount of \$500 to Abington Audiology for Vohrer giving a beginning and ending balance of \$2049.27. The second correction was on the second page, paragraph 4, the Falls Lions Club did not have a Health Fair at the Senior Center. PCC Mark Kusma made mention that the minutes need to be free of mention of people's names with their medical status such as being in the hospital. The is due to the HIPAA Laws. PDG Butch Sands made a motion to accept the minutes and seconded by PDG Karen Cokely and passed unanimously.

(No record made of ending balance for the month; therefore this is September's balance: \$5,882.63)

Gordi Potratz asked if anyone is taking over Irene's duties? He inquired about an application for Anna Ray from their club. PDG Butch Sands and PDG Karen Cokely stated that they are getting the mail and going through it but will be processing the mail more thoroughly soon. DG Fran Stepkovitch submitted an application on behalf of Dr. Ken Savitski from the Jessup Lions Club for a woman for glasses. PDG Butch Sands returned the application to DG Fran Stepkovitch requesting proof of income to accompany the application. PDG Karen Cokely reported that the Hearing account balance started with \$2,049.27 with one check written in the amount of \$500 to the Abington Audiology for Kiegler and a deposit of \$200 from Tunkhannock's co-pay for Vohrer and \$50 for applicant Kiegler's co-pay, leaving an ending balance of \$1,799.27. She advised that they both had a copy of the invoice but that if PDG Butch Sands cannot find it she will provide another copy.

DG Fran Stepkovitch and two other Eynon/Archbald Lions Club members, Andrea and Erin went to the Newton/Ransom Day Dreamers Day Care and screened 50 children with 8 referrals. The club also provides financial aid to special needs children to attend Dyberry Day Camp, such as organizing a trip to a Railriders ball game and an annual Christmas party in their honor. The club is always looking to identify worthy causes that they may not be knowledgeable of. Two club members, Paul and Sandy Meagher were honored by the Wayne County Community Foundation with the Ben Franklin Community Service Award. Lion Leroy Spoor was lauded by the Lions Club International District 14-H with the Pennsylvania Counsellors Distinguished Service Award. District 14-H Governor, Fran Stepkovitch, recognized the Lions Club for their service to their community for 95 years, the club was chartered on March 25, 1925. A proud point for the Lions Clubs is that they are a 0-overhead organization, in that "All the money that is raised by the Lions Clubs goes back to our communities.
