TO: 2019-2020 State Council of Governors, Lions of Pennsylvania International Family, Vice District Governors, MD-14 Committees and Coordinators and interested Lions

Multiple District 14 State Council Chairperson William H. Morgan has issued a call for the 2019-2020 PA State Council of Lions Clubs' Council of Governors to convene for its third Regular Meeting at 1:00 p.m. Saturday, February 8, 2020 at the Ramada by Wyndham State College Hotel & Conference Center, 1450 South Atherton Street, State College, PA. third Preliminary Meeting at 2:00 p.m. Friday, February 7, 2020 at the hotel.

In addition to the State Council meetings, select state committees will hold meetings Saturday morning, February 8, 2020 at the hotel. State committee chairpersons and coordinators desiring to be assigned meeting times and space must contact the State Office prior to December 31, 2019.

Two meal functions — a luncheon and an evening banquet — will be held Saturday, February 8, 2020, as part of the State Council meeting weekend. An RSVP form is included in this Call of Meeting packet.

Individuals desiring discounted overnight accommodations (\$80.00/night plus tax) at the Ramada by Wyndham State College will need to <u>call the hotel reservation desk at (814) 238 3001</u>. Online reservations will not be available. Please use code "CG07LC" or "the Pennsylvania Lions State Council Meeting" when calling to make reservations. <u>The discounted rate is only valid for reservations made through January 7, 2020</u>.

Committee chairpersons/coordinators who have an Action Item for State Council to consider at the February 8, 2020 meeting <u>must</u> submit that item in written form to the State Office no later than Wednesday, January 22, 2020. Any Action Item proposal received by the State Office less than 14 days prior to a State Council meeting must be approved by a two-thirds vote (12 of 18) of the Council of Governors before it may be presented for consideration. An Action Item that does not receive the needed two-thirds vote for consideration will be tabled until the next State Council meeting. Committee chairpersons/coordinators with Action Items must be present or have a representative at both the Preliminary and Regular State Council meetings. With some notable exceptions, all oral committee reports to State Council will be subject to a three-minute time limit. Complete versions of all written committee reports will be included in the official minutes of the State Council meeting.

This story is the way to start off 2020

The story of this young boy came to us this summer at our local hometown days event. His grandmother noticed our float with the banner that read "WE SERVE, FOR ALL THE WORLD TO SEE". She approached our booth afterwards and asked if there was anything we could do to help. She explained the situation of her young grandson, Zayn. He was just 8 months old and recently just diagnosed with a rare eye issue. He was discovered to be blind in one eye and had a serious problem with the other eye. His parents have been all over Northeast PA to see specialists on a regular basis. There have been times where they have needed to stay in hotels in Philadelphia due to appointments and procedures multiple days in a row. Zayn's father works full time and does have insurance, but like most policies, it does not cover everything. The medications, co-pays, deductibles are all adding up, then there are the hotel rooms, parking and tolls expenses as well.

Our president, Lion Dan Lake, met with the Family. He stated they are hardworking and caring people that have been devastated, emotionally and financially, with their child's medical issue. The Grandmother had put on a basket benefit in town to help with their mounting expenses. The family was greatly appreciative of all the support they have received. Our Lions club donated \$2,000 to help and then applied for a grant from the NEPA Lions Service Foundation. We are pleased to say the application was just recently approved for \$9,500.





These stories are what should make you proud to be a Lion -- <u>WE Sreve</u> Halloween Parade - Our annual event was October 26th at the school. About 50 kids came out dressed in their costumes. We served donuts and apple cider and gave out candy. There were four age groups (infants and toddlers, Pre-K & Kindergarten, 1st-3rd grades, and 4th-6th grades) and five categories; scariest, original, creative, royalty & superheroes. \$5 each, total of \$100 in prize money.

The Stone Bridge Lions Club recently donated a Traps portable drum set to our Pep Band. Thank you!


