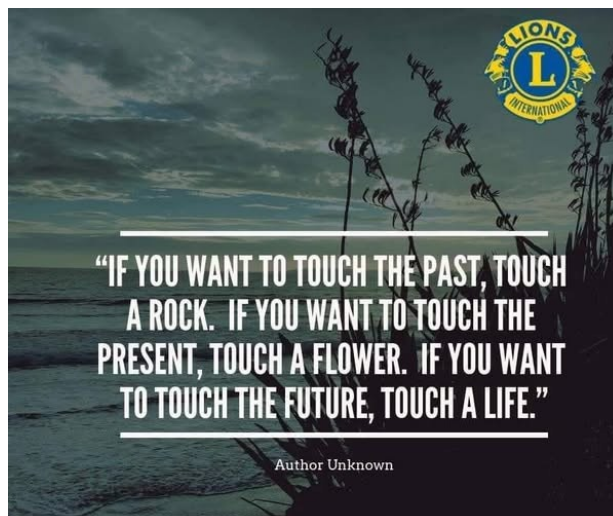

## NOTE: PLEASE READ—YOUR ACTION CAN HELP!

Dear Leader Dog Community,

The department of Education has announced a reduction in force that would eliminate most positions within the Office of Special Education and Rehabilitation Services (OSERS), effective December 9, 2025.

If these layoffs proceed, they could undermine the Department's ability to carry out its responsibilities under the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act of 1973, and the Randolph-Shepp Act. This would disrupt access to Braille education, mobility and employment training, and entrepreneurial opportunities for people who are blind or have low vision — services that are critical to the independence we foster every day at Leader Dogs for the Blind.

We urge you to take action. Please contact your elected officials and let them know that these programs must be protected. Your voice can help preserve the resources that empower people who are blind or have low vision. [Find your representative.](#)

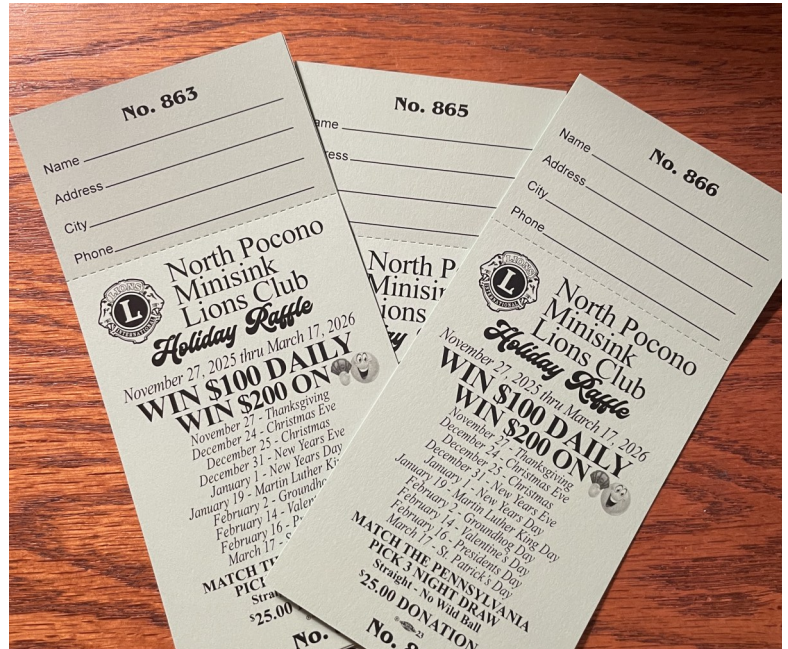
