HONG KONG 2026

108th Lions International Convention

Some important updates to our 2026 international convention in Hong Kong:

As many of you know, we moved convention to Hong Kong after our planned destination of Atlanta was cancelled by the city of Atlanta due to the FIFA World Cup. Our host Lions and the city of Hong Kong stepped up to help us transition to our new location. As we worked together to support this significant shift, we recently identified schedule adjustments needed to align with our host city's guidelines and maintain the convention's overall structure.

We will be updating our [Convention Schedule webpage](https://lionscon.org) on lionscon.org with more details as they are confirmed, but here are some initial updates we'd like to share with you.

- **Convention Dates:** Convention dates **are not changing**, only the convention schedule, so we will still be hosting convention July 3-7.
- **Plenary Sessions:** Our three plenary sessions will be moved up one day, now scheduled for July 4-6.
- **Parade of Nations:** The parade will be **moved to Tuesday, July 7** pending finalization of plans.
- **Elections:** Elections will be held July 4-6.
- **Pre- and Post-Convention Events:** There are currently no planned changes to pre- and post-convention events such as the board meeting, the DGE Seminar, the post-convention board meeting and New Directors Orientation.

Please share your questions with us at 2026Convention@lionsclubs.org, and we will continue to provide updates as they become available.

We know that convention is such an important moment for our Lions, and we truly apologize for any inconvenience these changes may cause you or your Lions.

We want to sincerely thank you for your leadership and your support, and we're looking forward to an incredible convention in Hong Kong.

 - Direct contributions need to be clear as to where the donation should be directed within Beacon Lodge
 - Beacon Cabin – specify cabin
 - Beacon Camp – general fund
 - Governor Comments
 - Goals
 - New members – continue to recruit
 - New clubs – District goal is 2 new clubs. In the past, Gouldsboro club members moved to Minisink club. Carbondale may be a possibility. It may be possible to recruit special interest groups to begin a club. We need to increase our visibility to help grow the district.
 - Forming Leo Clubs
 - Look for church, home school groups, other youth groups for potential LEO groups. School districts have not always been open to supporting LEO Clubs
 - Need a sponsor club, and a member of that club to be an advisor. The club pays \$100 to LCI
 - Leo Dues – Young LEOs do not pay dues. Funds are provided by the sponsoring club (\$100 plus other optional support)
 - Leos can be on the Lions portal and can record their activities (some do and some do not – Blue Ridge is very active but does not currently record their activities)
 - We need to increase reporting of our activities on the portal. Both community service projects and fundraising projects should be reported. Grants and donations are easier for LCI to obtain when they have information about activities across the International Lions Club
